

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


OUR 3 PILLARS







2. STRATEGY

Two-folded approach: reactive crisis management with consideration of long-term strategy







Our approach is two-folded - we provide crisis management of the humanitarian response with consideration for mid and long-term scenarios based on the weekly situational analysis of trends as well as offering creative evidence-based solutions.

We believe that the most effective crisis management in the situation of Ukrainian Displacement is a combination of effective central responses and the facilitation of regional networks. Since there is no control over the movement of displaced individuals nor direct access to translation and supportive services — we have to create, facilitate and identify local responses which provide informational platforms and instructions (both in a trickle-down and bottom-up approach). Meanwhile, to avoid discrepancies in the support strategies - we should strive for standardization of housing, financial, and educational support.
